New Electricity Tariff For Sabah and Federal Territory of Labuan by Sabah Electricity Sdn Bhd (SESB)

The Sabah Electricity Sdn Bhd (SESB) on January 31, 2026 had announced a new electricity tariff revision for Sabah and F.T. Labuan effective on **February 1, 2026**.

The new average base tariff has been revised from 34.52 sen per kilowatt hour (kWh) to 39.70 sen per kilowatt hour (kWh), an increase of 5 sen. The increase was inevitable to reduce dependency on Federal government subsidies and to minimise the power disruptions. This is line with the **Sabah Energy Roadmap and Master Plan 2040 (SE-RAMP 2040)** where the State government plans to take over Sabah Electricity Sdn Bhd from Federal government by 2030.

Under the new industrial electricity tariff structure, SESB introduced four tariff categories based on the power usage. The categories are as follows:

	For all kWh during the Off-Peak Period	Sen/kWh	25.46
	The minimum monthly charge is RM1,000.00		
iv.	Tariff Street Lighting		
	For all kWh (with maintenance)	Sen/kWh	41.54
	For all kWh (without maintenance)	Sen/kWh	23.23
	The minimum monthly charge is RM1,000.00		

SESB has also introduced **Tariff Rider Scheme**, an electricity pricing option offered to eligible consumers, on top of the current tariff structure in force. These tariff riders are offered to encourage demand side management. Eligible consumers will gain additional savings when using electricity during the specific situations ranging from 10% to 20%. The available tariff schemes are as follows:

i. Off Peak Tariff Rider

The Off-Peak Tariff Rider (OPTR) scheme is available to low-voltage commercial and industrial consumers who are currently not benefiting from any off-peak tariff rates. This applies to consumers under the Low Voltage Commercial and Industrial Tariff (CM1 & ID1) with CT-operated meters rated at 3 x 150/5A and above.

Consumers enrolled in the OPTR scheme will enjoy a 20% discount on electricity usage or consumption during off-peak hours (10.00 p.m. to 8.00 a.m.) every day.

ii. Agriculture, Aquaculture & Aquamarine

A 10% electricity tariff discount is granted to customers engaged in Agriculture, Aquaculture, and Aquamarine (AAA) operations. The objective of this policy is to support national food security, strengthen rural economic development, and promote sustainable primary production by providing eligible AAA operators with targeted electricity tariff discounts. The policy aims to reduce operational costs, enhance productivity, and ensure equitable access to energy.

- Agriculture (crop farming, livestock, horticulture, agro-based primary production)
- Aquaculture (inland and marine fish farming, shrimp farming, hatcheries)
- Aquamarine (marine-based primary production, seaweed farming, coastal hatchery operations)

The application must be submitted to Sabah Electricity Sdn Bhd, but the approval is subject to consumer eligibility.
